ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Levels:

Rally handler/dog teams compete in their lowest eligible class from level 1 to level 6. They may also compete at the subsequent level. Progression to the next level does not require either wins or places. Progression is dependent upon gaining three Excellent scores, under three different judges, or six qualifying scores under four different judges. Levels 1-2 have a qualifying score of 175 out of 200

In all levels a qualifying score of 190 or above equates to an excellent score

Eligibility:

When entered for a competition, a dog must be entered in a standard class at the level for which it is eligible. The dog may also, if desired, be entered in one further standard class at the next level up, if scheduled, plus one additional special class, if scheduled.

Level 1: Open to dogs which have not achieved a Level 1 or Level 1 Excellent Title

Level 2: Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 1 or Level 1 Excellent Title, except those that have achieved a Level 2 or Level 2 Excellent Title, Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 1 may also enter at this level.

REFRESHMENTS will be available throughout the day

- ***RAFFLE: Many raffle prizes will be on offer, don't forget to buy your tickets to win one or more of the prizes. Donations of prizes for the raffle will be most welcome***
- ***PLEASE clean up after your dog and leave the venue as clean as you would wish to find it. Do not leave dogs in hot cars.***

Directions

From M4 (east)

At Exit 19 take M32 towards Bristol

Take first exit and turn west (right) on A4174 towards Filton. At second roundabout turn left on A38 towards Bristol

From M4 (west)

At Exit 20 take M5 south towards South West

From M5 (north or south)

At Exit 16 take A38 south towards Filton and Bristol

Straight on at Aztec roundabout and after 2 miles straight on at second roundabout on A38 towards Bristol

From A38 take second left (after 150 yds) into Elm Park and follow signs (next left) to Filton Leisure and Folk Centre

RULES AND REGULATIONS

These Rules and Regulations are to be read in conjunction with The Kennel Club Rally Regulations S under which this show is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this show to make themselves familiar with the Kennel Club Rally Regulations available from the Kennel Club

1. Judges as listed reserve judges will be appointed as necessary
2. Entry fee is £5.00 per dog, per class
3. ROSETTES to 6th place with Prize Cards. Qualifying certificates for all scores of 170 or better
4. Show opens 9.a.m. Judging commences 10 a.m.
5. First walk through is at 9.30 a.m. Competitors to report to Show Secretary's desk to book in and collect competitors ring no.
6. No bitch in season is allowed to compete
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form
10. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil their appointment the organizer reserves the right to appoint alternative judge
12. It is the competitors responsibility to be available for their class and running order
13. Should circumstances so dictate the organizer, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes will be reported to the Kennel Club
14. Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Shows in level 1 and 2
15. Competitors to report to Secretary's desk to collect competition ring numbers the book in at the Score Steward's Table.
16. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the precincts of the show.

17. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
18. After a dog has commenced competing in a class no substitution of handler is permitted in that class
19. For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area, must be on a lead except when competing or practicing prior to competition.
20. Food or toys shall not be carried in the ring or given to a dog whilst under test.
21. The attention of competitors is drawn specifically to the Kennel Club Rally Competition Regulations 9, 17 and 19
22. A dog cannot be entered in the same class more than once
23. Once a dog has entered the ring to compete, no further practice may be carried Out
24. A dog must at the time of entry for the competition, be registered as required by KC Rules and Regulations in the owner's name (or registration or transfer applied for) In the case of joint registered owners the full name of every registered owner must be given. Where an owner makes an entry on behalf of another, joint registered owners or where an agent enters on behalf of a single or joint registered owner, such person must have the authority and consent from the single or joint registered, A dog must, at the time of entry for the competition be owner(s) to sign the entry form on their behalf thereby binding them to all to KC Rules and Regulations. In the event of any dispute, evidence of such authority and consent will be required. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a completion may compete as the new owners property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the KC before the competition and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form (and in accordance with the conditions set out above.

25 Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.

26. Following discussion between the Chief Steward and the show management, a dog shall be removed from the show if it is (a) a bitch which is in season (b) suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, (c) interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent, (d) of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal, (e) likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing. The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition incident book and submitted to the KC

27. Judges discretion prevails and Judges decisions are final

28. Welfare of Dogs: A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for Disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any Rally event licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the competition.

29. No modifications may be made to the Schedule once published except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club which must be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press if possible.

30. Animals allowed at Show. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the Show during its continuance, except any dog registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes, or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times

31. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
